<u>Common Names</u>	<u>Scientific Name</u>	<u>LV: leaves; FL: flowers; FR:fruit; ST:stem; EC:ecology</u>
<u>Western mountain maple</u> (Rocky Mountain maple)	<u>Acer glabrum</u>	LV: opposite, <6"; FL: 5 parts; FR: samara; ST: tree/shrub; EC: edible-FR ST-buds
<u>Bigleaf maple</u> (Oregon maple)	<u>Acer macrophyllum</u>	LV: opposite; FL: 5 parts; FR: samara; ST: tree; EC: edible-FR ST
<u>Boxelder</u> (Manitoba maple, ash-leaved maple)	<u>Acer negundo</u>	LV: opposite, 3-palmate; FL: 5 parts; FR: samara; ST: shrub; EC: poisonous-FR, edible-ST-sap
<u>Striped maple</u> (moosewood, moose maple, goosefoot maple)	<u>Acer pensylvanicum</u>	LV: opposite, lobed, serrate, base-cordate, >6"; FL: 5 parts; FR: samara; ST: shrub/tree <12', green/white stripes, buds-valvate; EC: edible-FR ST
<u>Norway maple</u>	<u>Acer platanoides</u>	LV: opposite, red/purple; FR: 5 parts; FR: samara; EC: edible-FR ST
<u>Red maple</u>	<u>Acer rubrum</u>	LV: opposite, lobed, serrate; FR: 5 parts, samara; ST: tree, buds imbricate ovoid red; EC: wetland, forest, edible-FR ST
<u>Silver maple</u>	<u>Acer saccharinum</u>	LV: opposite, cleft; FL: 5 parts, red yellow, raceme, sessile, winter spring, stamens long; FR: samara; ST: tree; EC: edible-FR ST
<u>Sugar maple</u>	<u>Acer saccharum</u>	LV: opposite, lobed, entire; FL: 5 parts; FR: samara; ST: tree, buds imbricate acute narrow brown; EC: edible-FR ST
<u>Mountain maple</u>	<u>Acer spicatum</u>	LV: opposite, base-cordate, >1"; FR: 5 parts; FR: samara; ST: shrub; EC: edible-FR ST
