<u>Wild garlic</u> (<u>Canada onion</u> , <u>Canadian garlic</u> , <u>meadow garlic</u> , <u>wild onion</u>)	<u>Allium canadense</u>	LV: basal, whole, linear, entire, apex acute, base acute, >6"; FL: 6 parts, red/pink/orange, umbel, <1", spring/summer; ST: herb, >1', erect; EC: edible LV ST-root
<u>Red onion</u>	<u>Allium cepa cultivar</u>	
<u>Nodding onion</u> (<u>lady's leek</u>)	<u>Allium cernuum</u>	LV: basal, whole, linear, entire, 2-10"; FL: 6 parts, red/violet, umbel, scapose, nodding, 1/4", jun-oct, stamen yellow; ST: herb, 4-20", erect, bulb; EC: edible LV ST-root
<u>Garlic</u>	<u>Allium sativum</u>	ST: bulb; EC: edible ST-root
<u>Wild leek</u>	<u>Allium tricoccum</u>	LV: basal, whole, oblong, entire, >6", parallel venation; ST: herb, erect; EC: forest, edible LV ST-root
<u>Field garlic</u>	<u>Allium vineale</u>	LV: basal, sessile, whole, acicular, entire, apex acuminate, base acute, >1"; FL: 6 parts, violet, head-globose, terminal, <1", spring/summer; ST: herb, >1', erect; EC: edible LV
